The Law Society has been a pioneer in promoting public legal education and developing the capacity and impact of legal professionals to deliver experiential, learnercentred programs such as Street Law and other access to justice methodologies. Centred on the social aspect of ESG a number of law firms and individual solicitors have also launched their own successful community engagement initiatives in this area.
